Mr Middleton, who built the Wrights Terrace house in 2002 from recycled materials said it was a good example of a water-smart

He said the house saved up to 100,000 litres of water a year through the use of water-efficient appliances and collected rainwater. The 15,000-litre corrugated iron water tank can collect 6000 litres of rainwater in an hour and can slash household consumption by almost

70 per cent The tank water is used on gardens and to flush the toilet saving 164,000

litres a year on average. "People don't understand how much water you can save just by implementing simple design elements such as water-efficient shower heads and strategically
